Moses argued, "Oh, my LORD, I am not a great speaker."


The LORD answered, "Who made man's mouth? Who makes people mute, or deaf, or seeing, or blind? Go! I will tell you what to say."

Moses was a VERY OLD man when he went to talk to Pharaoh, probably older than your grandpa, or maybe even as old as your great-grandpa.

You are very young. You may have sat in a walker while you were learning to walk, and you held on to your parents' hands.

Can you imagine being an old, old man or an old, old woman? Sometimes old people can't walk very well, and they need to use a cane or walker to help them stand.

God gives you the years of your life. As you get older, you will grow and learn more about Jesus. You will learn to "walk by faith" and trust in Jesus to save you. He loves you!

Some day, if you live for many years, you will be an old man like Moses, or an old woman like Anna the prophetess, who saw Jesus when He was a tiny baby. Imagine that!

Remember when Moses was a little baby? He floated in a basket boat in the river and the princess of Egypt found him. His sister ran to get their mother to take care of Moses for the princess. When Moses was old enough, he went to live in the Pharaoh's



palace. The princess adopted Moses, and he grew up with the Pharaoh as his grandfather. When Moses was grown, he went to a land far away, and he lived there many years.

Pharaoh, the King of Egy

"Pharaoh" is not a name, it is a title like "king." The Pharaoh ruled over the whole country of Egypt, and he was a very powerful man. He had the power to put Moses to death if he was angry.



While Moses was gone from Egypt for forty years, several rulers had come and gone. The Pharaoh who was in power when Moses came back to Egypt was not the same Pharaoh who had ruled when Moses was a boy. Moses wasn't going to talk to his adopted grandfather, but a different man entirely. This powerful ruler was not happy to have all of his slaves leaving Egypt!

Moses may have been afraid to speak to the king of Egypt, but he obeyed God's command. God told him to go, and Moses went! Moses stood before the powerful Pharaoh and said:

Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Let my people go!

Exodus 5:1




# The Slavery of Sin

Slavery's a very sad business. It means that one person owns other people, like property. Slaves are not free. They must obey their

master or be punished. Slaves can't make decisions or go where they want to go. They are bought and sold, and families can be broken up.

The children of Israel worked very hard as slaves in Egypt. They were beaten if they didn't work hard enough or fast enough. They were treated very poorly, and they were miserable. They cried out to God to help them, and God heard their cries. He saw their suffering, and He chose Moses to deliver them out of slavery in Egypt.



People who don't believe in Jesus are slaves. Slaves to sin. The devil is their master, and he doesn't want to let them go. He "beats" them with temptations and punishments. Families can be broken up by the devil and sin. Unbelievers may not know that they are slaves. They may not realize that they are miserable. But they are not free.

Only God can rescue people from the slavery of sin and death. God sent Jesus to deliver people from slavery. He sent Jesus to die on the cross in our place. Jesus said, "Whoever sins is a slave to sin. But if the Son will make you free, you will be free indeed." Jesus makes people truly free. He takes away sin and gives His perfection to those who trust in Him.

Pray for people who don't believe in Jesus. Pray that God will deliver them from the slavery of sin. Pray that they will cry out to God to save them. God will hear their cries. He sees their suffering, and He sent Jesus to deliver them!

slavery was made illegal in the United States many years ago, but there are places where slavery still exists. Pray that the Light of Jesus will shine brightly in the hearts of sinners, and that God will bring true freedom to people in all the dark places in the world.



## The Holy Name of the Lord

Have you ever noticed that the word "Lord" is written differently in certain places in the Bible? Sometimes it is written as LORD (Psalm 23), and sometimes it is written as Lord (Exodus 4:13). And there is a difference!

LORD (ALL CAPITALS!) is the holy NAME of God. The English name "Jehovah" comes from this word. It is written YHVH in English and like this in Hebrew:

Hebrew is read from right to left, opposite of the direction we read. Hebrew starts HERE and goes backward! The letters are yod-hey-vav-hey—YHVH.

The Hebrews—the children of Israel—did not speak God's holy Name or write it down. EVER. Remember the second commandment? The Hebrew people would not use God's Name so they would never take it in vain. When the scribe read the Scriptures, he would say "Adonai" which means Lord, instead of speaking the sacred Name. Or he would say the words "the Name" instead of speaking the Name.

Lord (first letter capitalized) in the Old Testament refers to God's TITLE, not His actual Name. In the New Testament, Lord (*kurios* in Greek) is used as "master."

To further complicate things, *Adonai* is sometimes used WITH the name JHVH, translated literally "Lord LORD"! But that sounds awkward in English, so mostly they use Lord GOD for *Adonai* JHVH (Genesis 15:2).

LORD = YHVH = The Unspeakable Name of God Lord = Adonai (Hebrew) = title Lord LORD = Adonai YHVH = Lord GOD Lord = Kurios (Greek) = lord or master

This is complicated, but always remember that God's Name is holy. When you use God's Name or title in Hebrew or English, in any form — or if you refer to Him as God, as we most often do today — always reverence (show great respect for) the Name of the Lord. His Name is your strong tower. Run to Him and be safe!

The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.


Proverbs 18:10

When Moses asked God, "What is Your name?" the LORD answered, "I AM THAT I AM."
This is a thought-provoking

answer, to say the least!

"I AM THAT I AM" could be translated "I AM WHAT I AM."

This could mean that God is the Being or Person that He is, and no other Being or Person. God could have been saying, "I AM the One that I AM, and no one else." The LORD God, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob will never be anyone else. He will always be one God in three Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



Another way to translate "I AM THAT I AM" is "I WILL BE WHAT I WILL BE." It could be taken as: "I WILL BE the God that I WILL BE." God has existed forever, and He will always exist. God was the same in the past as He will be in the future. He will never change. His judgments are right. He keeps His promises. He is righteous, holy, and true.

Maybe "I AM THAT I AM" means "I AM WHO I AM" when stated in more modern English. God is who HE says He is, not who PEOPLE say He is. It could be understood as: "I AM who \*I\* say I AM." People make judgments and assumptions about God that aren't always true. The Bible says that in this life we can never truly know God, but some day we'll know Him fully, even as we are fully known. Now we see through a glass darkly, but some day we'll see Him face to face.

Maybe God was answering the question like you would answer. If someone asked your name, you would say, "I am Michael" or "I am Hannah." God could have been saying, "I am I AM!" With this thought in mind, read the following verses:

Moses said unto God, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them? And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.

Exodus 3:13-14

Do you know the Great I AM, the LORD God, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob? Do you trust Him to deliver you from the slavery of sin and death? Believe in Him! He is trustworthy!

### Miracles and More Miracles

When the LORD commanded Moses to tell the elders of Israel that God had appeared to him, Moses argued with God. Moses said, "But, look! They won't believe me! They won't listen to me, and they will say, 'The LORD has not appeared to you!"

The LORD said to him, "What is in your hand?"

Moses answered, "A walking staff."

The LORD said, "Throw it on the ground."

Moses threw the staff on the ground. It became a snake, and Moses ran away from it! The LORD told Moses, "Reach out your hand and catch it by the tail." So Moses reached out and caught the snake and it became a staff in his hand. The LORD continued, "So they will believe that the LORD God of their fathers has appeared to you."

Then the LORD told Moses to put his hand inside his coat. Moses did, and when he took his hand out again, it was pure white with leprosy, a contagious skin disease. God said, "Put your hand back inside your coat." Moses obeyed, and when he took his hand out again, it was just like the rest of his skin! "If they won't believe you or listen to the first sign," God continued, "they will believe the second sign. And if they still won't believe these two signs, you will take water from the river and pour it out on the dry land and it will turn into blood on the ground."

The LORD told Moses to take the staff that had turned into a snake when he went in to speak with the Pharaoh. Moses did these miracles — and many others — before the Pharaoh and the children of Israel. The LORD God of Israel had sent him to deliver the people of Israel from the slavery of Egypt, and God stretched out His mighty hand, performing wonders and miracles by the hand of His servant Moses.


